Dear Suffolk Public Schools Family:

As you are well aware, the last few days have been unprecedented across the state, country and world due the COVID-19, commonly known as the coronavirus. As I stated in my video on Friday, March 13, 2020, Governor Northam declared that all schools in the Commonwealth of Virginia be closed for a minimum of two weeks. As this situation continues to evolve, you have our promise that Suffolk Public Schools will keep you updated via school messenger, email, and our social media channels. Our top priority is the safety of our staff and students during this public health crisis.

Suffolk Public Schools will be on an altered schedule from Tuesday, March 17, 2020-Friday, March 27, 2020. Our school buildings will be closed at 3:00 P.M. on March 16, 2020. The majority of our staff will "telework" as we will follow the CDC guidelines of allowing staff to remain in their homes and to limit outside interactions. It is our plan to have only essential staff available to continue some of the daily operations of the school division.

Medication

A parent or guardian listed on the student's emergency card will be able to pick up medication and/or treatment at the front office of their child's school through Tuesday, March 17, 2020 between the hours of 8 A.M. - 12 noon. Please remember to bring ID for verification.

Food Distribution

Beginning Tuesday, March 17, 2020 through March 27, 2020, we will have bagged meals that will include both breakfast and lunch available to our students. King's Fork High School will be our food distribution hub and will be open for food distribution in the school lobby from 9 A.M.-12 noon. Students will need to be present to receive food, as meals. Our Food and Nutrition department will distribute food to our students through our SPS transportation

will not count against them, and that the SOL calendar will be adjusted based on the total number of days missed. Also, no decisions have been made to change Spring Break at this time. We will keep you updated on any changes to the school calendar.
